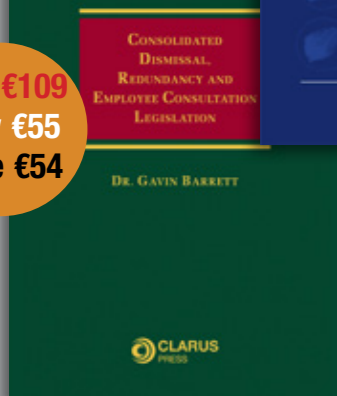

Directive in Ireland. It replaces the Criminal Justice Act 1994 as the legislative centrepiece of Ireland's anti-money laundering and anti-terrorist financing regime.

- New provisions concerning politically exposed persons.
- Reporting requirements arising under the Act.
- Offence of "tipping off".
- Provisions for the monitoring of designated persons by competent authorities.
- Authorisation of trust or company service providers.
- Approval of guidelines by the Minister for Justice and Law Reform.
- Registration of persons directing private members' clubs at which gambling activities are carried on.
- "Whistle-blowing" or "good faith reporting" provision made in the Act.

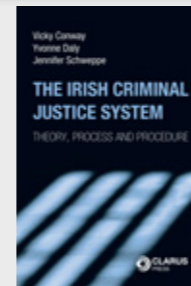
